CREDIT UNION PRIVACY STATEMENT

Public Employees Credit Union collects nonpublic personal information about our members and others from data received on your applications, other business related forms, information about your transactions with us or others, consumer reporting agencies, and other usual business sources.

The Credit Union may disclose information we collect to companies that perform marketing services on our behalf or to other financial institutions with whom we have a joint marketing agreement. We do not allow these companies to sell or otherwise provide this information to others and require they maintain strong confidentiality protections.

Nonpublic personal information about you is restricted to Credit Union personnel who need to know such information in order to provide products and services to you. Your Credit Union maintains physical, electronic, and procedural safeguards that comply with federal regulations to guard your nonpublic personal information.

Visitors to this website will remain anonymous. We do not collect personal information about visitors to our site; however, we may collect statistical information such as time and date visited, and related information in order to gauge the effectiveness of the site.

Public Employees Credit Union is committed to safeguarding your privacy.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP PROTECT YOUR PRIVACY

Use caution when disclosing personal information such as account numbers, social security numbers, employment ID numbers, credit card numbers, and other such data to others. Be sure those requesting the information have a legitimate right to know.

Credit Union personnel have access to such information as your account number and you should be cautious of anyone calling and stating they represent us and then ask for your account number. You might want to ask the caller to give you the account number they have for you to verify it. Be careful of e-mail requests from various sources indicating it is an official request for your account number. We will not contact you in these manners.

Keep your personal information with Public Employees Credit Union up to date. It is important that we have current information on how to reach you and a valid mailing address. If you change your phone number or address, notify us as soon as possible.

Safeguard your ATM/debit cards, credit cards, checks, and other account records. Do not allow unauthorized people to use your account. Notify us immediately if you suspect fraud or theft.
